ALL Derbyshire juniors are encouraged to enter this event.

All entrants from Derbyshire are guaranteed a place.

This is not an ES sanctioned event, following a decision by ES earlier in the year.

This County Closed is also the selection event for all the Derbyshire Junior Inter County teams: string orders will be <u>informed</u> by finishing position at this tournament. Final string order decisions will be made by the Junior Development Team & Team Managers.

All age groups will play out to final positions, however, the optimum format for each age group will be determined by the number of entrants. Each player will be guaranteed at least 2 matches. Minimum of 3 players per age group.

Matches will be PAR to 11, best of FIVE games with tie-break to two clear points at 10-10. Draws and schedule will be posted on our Facebook page & emailed to all entrants by 18th September.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- The tournament will be played to ES regulations for players and parents. Copies of these regulations are
 attached on page 3 & are also available on request from the tournament organiser (TO), who expects everyone
 present to be mindful of creditable conduct at all times please. Parents must refrain from interference in
 matches and marking decisions.
- 2. Players must be under the relevant age on the day of the tournament
- 3. All players should report to the tournament desk 30 minutes prior to their start time. The tournament organiser reserves the right to scratch a player for a late arrival to any match.
- 4. All players must be willing to referee matches when asked; failure to do so may lead to disqualification.
- 5. Both players will mark the following match together as per new ES guidance; unless there is an obvious mismatch of ages, in which case, the TO will find substitute markers.
- 6. The wearing of ES approved eye protection is mandatory for junior players at all times when on court.

FINAL Closing date for entries is 9pm on Sunday 10th September.

Entries received after this date <u>may</u> be accepted at TO discretion, the cost will be £15, and no clothing will be provided.

All silverware/trophies from last year must be returned to the organiser in good condition by this closing date.

Entry fee (cheques payable to Derbyshire Squash Rackets Association) variable between £10-20 depending on T-shirt/hoodie requirements.

Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date has passed.

Code of Conduct - Players

Who does this apply to?

The Players Code of Conduct applies to all individuals who participate in the sport as a player at every level.

If the code is breached and reported, all complaints and allegations will be acted upon accordingly. Players will:

- Abide by the rules of the club or venue.
- Treat everyone equally regardless of age, ability, gender, race, religion, ethnic origin, social status or sexual orientation and accept that everyone has the right to be protected from abuse
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person within the context of the sport
- Know and abide by the rules of the game
- Accept the referees decision without question or complaint (let the captain or coach ask the necessary questions)
- Avoid violence and rough play
- Help injured players and opponents where appropriate
- Keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they
 are going to be late
- Players must wear suitable kit, including approved eyewear for junior players.*See approved eyewear section.
- Players must pay any fees for training or events promptly
- Respect the sport

I understand that if I do not follow the code of conduct, actions may be taken in line with the disciplinary procedures.

Code of Conduct - Parents

Who does this apply to?

The Parents Code of Conduct applies to all parents at any squash match or training session at every level within the game. If the code is breached and reported, all complaints and allegations will be acted upon accordingly.

Parents will:

- Abide by the rules and regulations of the club or venue
- · Focus on the child's efforts and enjoyment rather than winning or losing
- Encourage young people to play and not force them
- Provide positive verbal feedback in both training and matches
- Encourage players to participate within the rules and regulations of the game
- Applaud good performance and efforts from all individuals and teams
- Congratulate all participants on their performance regardless of the game's outcome
- Leave the coach to communicate with individual players during matches *parents should not enter the court of play
- Respect the decisions of officials and teach children to do the same
- Respect referees, officials, coaches, players and spectators
- Inform the team coach or manager of any injury, health or welfare issue that it is felt appropriate for them to know
- Remember that children participate in sport for their enjoyment, not their parents
- Treat everyone equally regardless of age, ability, gender, race, religion, ethnic origin, social status or sexual orientation and accept that everybody has the right to be protected from abuse
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person within the context of the sport
- Report any concerns in relation to a young person, follow reporting procedures laid down by England Squash
- A parent should not condone any form of discrimination or allow it to go unchallenged
